The campus is within easy traveling distance of Washington, D.C., to the east, Pittsburgh, Pa., to the north, and Cleveland and Columbus, Ohio, to the northwest. WVU is a large, land-grant university with a comprehensive Health Sciences Center. International Financial Aid

Blue and Gold merit-based scholarships (GPA and SAT) are available to international first time freshmen, with annual awards ranging from \$5,000 to \$7,000. International graduate students are eligible to apply for Graduate Teaching and Research positions, with a limited number of fellowships available.

Scholarships are also available for transfer students.
